## As a Year 2 Artist I will know...

## Pattern

- that surface rubbings can be used to add make patterns.
- that drawing techniques such as hatching, scribbling, stippling, and blending can make patterns.
- that patterns can be used to add detail to an artwork.


## Colour

- that different amounts of paint and water can be used to mix hues of secondary colours.
- that colours can be mixed to 'match' real life objects or to create things from your imagination.
- that colour can be used to show how it feels to be in a particular place, eg the seaside.


## Texture

- that collage materials can be chosen to represent real-life textures.
- that collage materials can be overlapped and overlaid to add texture.
- that drawing techniques such as hatching, scribbling, stippling, and blending can create surface texture.


## Form/Shape

- that 'composition' means how things are arranged on the page.
- that pieces of clay can be joined using the 'scratch and slip' technique.
- that a clay surface can be decorated by pressing into it or by joining pieces on.
- that collage materials can be shaped to represent shapes in an image.
- that shapes can be organic (natural) and irregular.
- that shapes can be geometric if they have mostly straight lines and angles.
- that patterns can be made using shapes.


## Tone

- that shading helps make drawn objects look more three dimensional.
- that different pencil grades make different tones.


## Line

- that lines can be used to fill shapes, to make outlines and to add detail or pattern.


## As a Year 2 Artist I can...

## Drawing

$\checkmark$ Further develop mark-making within a greater range of media, demonstrating increased control.
$\checkmark$ Experiment with drawing on different surfaces, and begin to explore tone using a variety of pencil grade ( $\mathrm{HB}, 2 \mathrm{~B}, 4 \mathrm{~B}$ ) to show form, drawing light/dark lines, patterns and shapes.

## Painting \& mixed media

$\checkmark$ Begin to develop some control when painting, applying knowledge of colour and how different media behave foe examples, adding water to thin paintMix different hues of primary and secondary colours by using different amounts of each starting colour or by adding water.Make choices about which materials to use for collage based on colour, texture, shape and pattern.
Sculpture \& 3D
$\checkmark$ Develop my understanding of 3D forms to construct and model simple forms using a range of materials.Use hands and tools with confidence when cutting, shaping and joining paper, card and malleable materials.Develop basic skills for shaping and joining clay, including exploring surface texture.

## Craft \& Design

$\checkmark$ Respond to a simple design brief with a range of ideas.
$\checkmark$ Apply skills in cutting, arranging and joining a range of materials to include card, felt and cellophane.Experiment with techniques when trying out design ideas.Follow a plan for a making process, modifying and correcting things and knowing when to seek advice.Talk about art I have seen using some appropriate subject vocabulary. Be able to make links between pieces of art.Explain my ideas and opinions about my own and other's art work, giving reasons.Begin to talk about how I could improve my own work.Begin to generate ideas from a wider range of stimuli, exploring different media and techniques.Experiment in sketchbooks, using drawing to record ideas.
