Last half term, KS2 were diving into an exciting history focus across the school!

Each year group explored a fascinating period from the past, helping them to develop a strong sense of chronology and curiosity about how people lived long ago.

Year 3 were learning about the Stone Age, discovering how early humans survived and how life began to change with the use of tools and farming. Y3 also went to Norton Priory for a Stone Age workshop.

Year 4 travelled back to Ancient Greece, exploring its rich culture, myths, and lasting influence on modern life.

Year 5 were investigating the Anglo-Saxons, finding out how their arrival shaped Britain and what life was like in their villages.

Meanwhile, Year 6 studied the Mayan civilisation, uncovering their achievements in architecture, astronomy, and writing.

Using our knowledge rich curriculum, retrieval slides to check understanding and a shared timeline, children are building strong connections between these different historical periods, deepening their understanding of how the past has shaped the world we live in today.

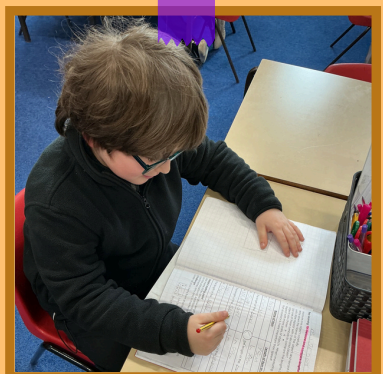
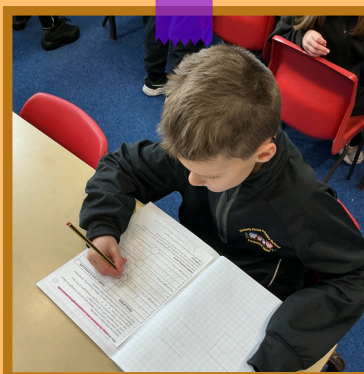
In Maths, we have been learning how to find the perimeter of shapes, using both practical resources and problem-solving skills.
